

THE INEXISTENCY OF TOURIST LAW

A Conceptual Analysis

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Academic literature has insisted on the existence of tourist law. Although the relationships between law and tourism are undeniable, their conceptual nomination is questionable. In this vein, by acknowledging the multidimensional character of tourism and the lack of exclusivity of law to any discipline, the paper suggests that such tourist law should not be regarded more than as a conceptual invention. This invention, according to the authors, has been adopted to attempt to legitimate the relationship between law and tourism from academic perspectives. This, however, does not necessarily justify the existence of such a compound concept.

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
